ORDINARY TIME

Ordinary Time refers to the period of the Catholic Church's liturgical year that fall outside of the major seasons of Advent, Christmas, Lent and Easter. Because of the connotations of the term "ordinary" in English, many people think Ordinary Time refers to the parts of the Church year that are unimportant. Nothing could be further from the truth. Ordinary Time is called "ordinary" because weeks are numbered. The Latin word ordinalis, which refers to numbers in a series, stems from the Latin word ordo, from which we get the English word order. Thus, Ordinary Time is in fact the ordered life of the Church. Vestments and altar cloths are green, the color of hope and growth. The Church counts the thirty-three or thirty-four Sundays of Ordinary Time, inviting her children to meditate upon the whole mystery of Christ - his life, miracles and teachings - in the light of his Resurrection.
